DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS REPORT

It is a blessing to serve Potomac Baptist Association and the fellowship of churches throughout Southern Maryland. Though each local church has met many challenges in this last year, God has richly blessed the association of churches in Potomac Baptist together. Our fellowship has grown as well as our ministry.

The Apostle Paul in 2 Corinthians 9 spoke of the "ministry to the saints in their generous gifts". **This describes associational life together.** We share prayer, financial gifts, and blessings to lift churches together sharing in the gospel of Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul in Spirit said, "*You will be enriched in every way for all generosity, which produces thanksgiving to God through us.*" ^(v.11) He continues by saying "*the ministry of this service* (giving financial gifts to help other churches) *is not only supplying the needs of the saints but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God.*" ^(v.12) And because of PBA churches giving generously, *God is glorified through your gifts and your generosity in sharing with each other and with everyone.* ^(v.13)

PBA churches' financial gifts have helped collectively PBA churches be on mission through scholarships, sharing supplies and needs to communities near the churches, sending relief to areas even far beyond Southern Maryland, supporting pastors and their wives, bringing men together in three counties to be encouraged in Jesus Christ, bringing women together in three counties to learn how to disciple and lead more women in Southern Maryland to Christ, and providing scholarships to many to go on mission locally and beyond, attend conferences to help churches revitalize and be strengthened, and to plant and water seeds of the gospel in community events like fairs, schools, and training. Your church gift to PBA produces thanksgiving to God!

And the work in this ministry is only just beginning! World Population Review shows Southern Maryland with continued increase in population. (Note: PBA includes the lower regions of Prince George's and Anne Arundel Counties but is almost impossible to find the population numbers limited to only the southern regions of both counties.)

- Charles County increased in population to 170,631
- Calvert County increased in population to 93,593
- And St. Mary's County increased in population to 115,503

So, Southern Maryland (excluding the lower portions of Prince George's and Anne Arundel County) has a mission field just under 400,000 people with an "unaffiliated" or "*nones to religion*" of 96,000 people! Imagine this number of souls without the gospel witness of Jesus Christ and then see the urgency of Christ's words, "Go and make disciples …" One local church could never reach the lostness of a community or county, but Christ Jesus has given us one another in association and with God "all things are possible". This is why we say for associational work, "We can do more together than one local church can."

PBA is not the church, but it is an association of like-minded churches in the gospel of Jesus Christ. **PBA Ready** (*see attached*) is strategically set to provide the **F.O.R.T.** (Fellowship, **Opportunity, Resource, and Training**) to reach out together as one in witness and testimony to the glory of Jesus Christ.

In my brief presentation tonight, I will share the strategic plan for *PBA Ready* and how your church can *Pray, Volunteer, and Give* to your Potomac Baptist Association as we reach out together to meet the lostness in Southern Maryland.

FINANCE TEAM REPORT 2022

2022 Achievements

- A successful year under the new leadership of Pastor Fred Caudle as the Director of Missions for the Potomac Baptist Association
- The Men's conference was the most attended and impactful event for the PBA. A lot of great feedback came from this event.
- Increased Missions and Evangelism support by \$7,800 YTD 2022 to provide Mission Trip Scholarships
- Increased Church support by \$7,500 YTD 2022 to provide a successful Men's retreat, Pastor/Wives Annual Dinner and Enrichment Opportunities for the Church's in PBA.
- Decreased administrative expenses by \$600 YTD 2022 at time where all expenses are increasing

2023 Goals

- Increase support for our Church Fellowship to include an increase for the Men's Conference and Women's Ministry
- New funding for Disaster Relief Scholarships to provide disaster relief training, including reimbursement of training costs to the Church's.
- Increase resources available for leadership trainings, missions, evangelism and specialty training by offering quarterly trainings
- Get increased support from our Church's to have the ability to continue with the programs the PBA is developing for 2023.

Budget

For the last 5 years the PBA budget has decreased. These decreases were necessary to keep the organization operating since income has reduced significantly over the past 6 years from \$227,000 in 2016 to a low of \$170,000 for 2021. YTD Income as of October 19, 2022 is \$121,099, which is a 5.6% decrease from 2021. Actual expenditures for 2022 Fiscal Year to Date are \$119,534. In prior years, we have accumulated savings to create reserves to service programs and growth expenses until the PBA gains recovered support.

The PBA staff and the finance committee propose a 2023 budget of \$177,294, which is \$12,591 or 7.7% higher than the budget presented for 2021. With the decrease in income YTD 2022, we are expecting the 2023 budgeted expenses to exceed the 2023 income and reduce our savings reserves, without increased support from Association members.

CHURCH PLANTING TEAM REPORT 2022

Churches are planted by churches. Potomac Baptist is an association of churches that come together to provide resources for a church to multiply by planting a new church. The Church Planting Team walks together with the church helping in strategy and seeking resources that can include sending teams from PBA churches to help in worship, surveying and canvassing the community, and most importantly to pray alongside of the planting church for wisdom, strength, guidance, and blessing.

New to the Church Planting Team is our **Church Strengthening** resource. Many times, a church finds herself plateaued, in need of spiritual counseling or direction, or simply seeking from the Lord a fresh vision to move forward. Church Strengthening is a valuable resource to our PBA churches to identify the surrounding community and patterns nearby the church, to consider movements within the church ministries over the last ten years, and then to see opportunities for revitalization and fresh vision to glorify the Lord. Church strengthening is a study bathed in prayer leading to vision for your entire church body. *This resource is a phone call away to our PBA office*.

MISSION TEAM REPORT 2022

PBA has been seeking to provide our PBA churches four areas of mission opportunity: Southern Maryland missions, United States missions, North American missions, and international missions. As each area is defined as *"go" ready*, we will be posting on our webpage "Missions" (under "News and Views"). Our vision is to provide our associational churches, large and small, opportunities to go on mission together locally to globally.
